

Cleaning Instructions

A: Instructions for Cleaning Standard Warming Cabinets:

Warming Cabinets must be cleaned on a regular basis in order to prevent unnecessary damage to the stainless steel surface. When cleaning the Warming Cabinets, make sure to use the proper cleaning agents and cleaning materials.



CAUTION: DO NOT USE the following cleaning materials on the stainless steel surfaces of the Warming Cabinets:

- Abrasive Pads
- Scrapers
- Steel Wool
- Wire Brushes
- Denatured Alcohol



CAUTION: DO NOT USE the following cleaning agents on the stainless steel surfaces of the Warming Cabinets:

- Hard Water
- Bleach or any product containing Chlorine
- Hydrochloric Acid

Use the following cleaning materials and agents:

- Soft, clean lint-free cloth
- Distilled Water
- Cleaners approved for use on stainless steel
- Distilled water with mild detergent



NOTE: Always follow the manufacturer's directions for any chemicals used on the stainless steel surfaces of the Warming Cabinets.

How to Clean the Warming Cabinet Interior:

1. Unplug and remove the Warming Cabinet from its power supply.



CAUTION: Turn OFF Circuit Breaker if Warming Cabinet is hard wired into the facility's electrical supply.

2. Open the door and remove all adjustable shelves and shelf clips.

- 3. Clean the adjustable shelves and shelf clips separately.
- 4. Using a damp, lent free, cloth and approved cleaner, wipe down the interior of the cabinet.
- 5. Use a lint free dry cloth to dry the cabinet's interior or let air dry. If air drying, ALWAYS leave the cabinet door open.

How to Clean Warming Cabinet's Exterior:

Stainless Steel:

 Use the commercially prepared stainless steel cleaner and follow the manufacturer's directions.

Glass Door:

1. Use a commercially prepared AMMONIA free glass cleaner or use Distilled Water and a Mild Detergent applied with a lint-free cloth.

Decals or Printed Labels:

 Use Distilled Water and a Mild Detergent applied with a lint-free cloth. DO NOT use any chemical cleaners.




Figure 1: Cleaning Stainless Steel

2. Clean the Warming Cabinet with the grain of the Stainless Steel. See Figure 1.



CAUTION: DO NOT flood, steam clean, or hose the Warming Cabinet at any time as damage to the cabinet's surfaces can occur. These methods can also result in an Electrical Hazard.
